
your recruiting.

### **Community**



### Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney Our Spiritual Father In Christ! By: Paul A. Crowley

I have always been fascinated with how many religious orders, both men and women view their founder as their spiritual father or Mother in Christ. An example of this would be the Franciscans viewing their founder, Saint Francis of Assisi as Holy Father Saint Francis because he is the Franciscan founder and that is why Franciscans have great love for him. Every October 4th is his feast day and while it is just a memorial for the Church, it is a solemnity and Holy day for all Franciscans! Even the Gloria and creed are said on his feast day in Franciscan places.

Every Saint that has foundered a religious order of some type had a great reason for doing so. Saint Francis had a vision one time where Our Lord asked him to rebuild his church. At first Francis started building the church building but our Lord was talking about his body the Church! Every Saint is called to build up the Church in a very special way. Every Saint's life is such a blessing to the Church, world and people of their time and it is a blessing that will never been seen again! On March 29, 1882 in the basement of Saint Mary Catholic Church in New Haven, Connecticut a handful of Catholic men gave the church and the world a great gift under the direction of one young parish priest who had very much concern for the widows and children of a departed Brother and for Catholics who were being discriminated against because of their faith. What started out as a nightmare turned out to a great blessing in disguise!

Those men who rallied around Father Michael J. McGivney gave the church and the whole world the Knights of Columbus that one March evening in 1882. Today the Knights of Columbus is the largest society of Catholic men and their families in the world. It all started with one spiritual father and priest of our Lord JESUS!

Just how a natural father shows great concern for his children, so do our Priests show great concern for their parishioners. Father McGivney was no different. He showed time after time the love and concern he had for the youth, aged, disabled and especially the widow and children whose bread winner was killed while working a dangerous job and he showed even more concern for the Catholics who were discriminated against and forced to take dangerous jobs.

Think about what Father McGivney had started out of that nightmare! Think of how he had great concern for his

spiritual children. Just like his parishioners that he served as a spiritual father to them so we too, the members of the Knights of Columbus and our families, are his spiritual sons and how he is our spiritual father in Christ! Just how the Franciscans celebrate every important moment in the life of Francis, his birth and death and other life events, we need to celebrate the important days in the life of Father McGivney, our father in Christ! His birthday is August 12th, his ordination today is December 22nd, the day he started the Knights of Columbus is March 29th and the anniversary of death is August 14th! May we, his son's look to him for guidance! May we ever keep upmost in our hearts the lessons of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism just like those first Brother Knights. May we care for the families of deceased members and build up the Church just like Saint Francis and his Franciscans did so long ago! May The Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, be our Holy Father in Fraternity and we his spiritual sons in Christ!
