
Heavenly LORD, God and Father of us all, we thank you for the gift of life. You are the LORD of life; you are always the giver of life.



What are you doing to improve your Community? Have you thought of what your Council would do in case of a disaster? Councils have helped out in their communities when needed. When these Councils have helped out in times of need they had plans. One of Supremes' programs is Disaster Preparedness.

This program motivates Councils and Parishes to learn what is needed to properly respond to an emergency situation, by assessing response time, and what will be needed in this emergency. Councils will engage their parish and community in disaster preparedness exercises by organizing training, fundraisers, and various activities.

Remember that for Supreme Awards there are mandatory activities, for the Community program it is Helping Hands. This program is designed to help the needy at a soup kitchen, repairing the facility of a local service organization, or something entirely unique. This helps your Council help your Community.

The Church program consists of two mandatory programs. They are: 1-Chaplain of the Year or Religious of the Year, activities that can be done to 2-SOS with final turn-in post marked not later than April 15. Then the Council can submit 3 choices. These 3 choices are any program that helps the priest or the Church community.

Please keep in mind that for the reporting of activities, they all need to be in the April 15, 2018. Don't forget to send me the report for the Chaplin or Religious of the year. If you just send the Activity Number 1 report to me. You will receive the 20 points. However, that person will not be included in the contest for the person of the

Year.

Please keep in mind that Supreme has Mandatory activities that must be done to get Star Council. The Faith In Action program has several fulfill requirements of the program.

Spiritual Reflection Program is a new Mandatory activity under the Church program. Other program that can serve as Electives include: Into the Breach, Marian Icon Prayer Program, Building the Domestic Church Kiosk, Holy Hour, Sacramental Gifts just to name a few. You can read more about these program on the Supreme website. More details will following in the next few months to let you know more about these activities.



Please keep in mind that there are requirements to fulfill the State General Program as well as requirements to fulfill Supreme's program. Supreme's program requirements allow councils the opportunity to apply for the Columbian Award (Form SP-7) at the end of the Fraternal year. The State General Program Manual, available at http://www.kofcohio.org, outlines the State General Program requirements. Supreme's program requirements align to the newly established Faith in Action programs and can be found at http:// www.kofc.org/un/en/programs/ index.html. It is important that Councils and all leaders familiarize themselves with both sets of requirements.

On Supreme's website, you can find additional information regarding the required Supreme Family program,

Consecration to the Holy Family. This calls for parish families to consecrate themselves to the Holy Family and devote themselves to the ideal model of familial love set by Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. A prayer, written by our Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William E. Lori, can help families live out the joy of Christ and consecrate themselves under the protection of the Holy Family. Councils are able to help their parishes strengthen their families with this activity as they work with their pastor to prepare for the Consecration to the Holy Family. Please plan accordingly, so you can fit this Supreme-required Family program in before the end of the Fraternal year!

Thank you to all of the councils holding some sort of Culture Of Life activity during Respect Life month this month. I know



we have many councils and individual members that do many things for their local Pro Life groups, especially during the month of October so thank you for all of your contributions in defending the right to life of every human being.

One of our greatest weapons in this battle for human life is prayer. With the new *Faith In Action* program from Supreme, there is a mandatory activity in the Life program area. This activity is the **Novena For Life**. In order to complete this, your council will need to work with your priest(s) at your parish(es), schedule a date for the 9 day novena, promote the novena, order and distribute prayer cards for the novena, and have as many people as possible participate in praying the Novena For Life. When done you can report it as a Culture Of Life activity in the State

Program and then also report it on your council Columbian Award application (Form SP-7) for the Supreme Council. The revision to the Columbian Award application for the Faith In Action program is not yet available, but I have been told that this activity is required for councils to receive the Columbian award and possibly the Star Council award. We do not want any councils to miss out on an award for failing to do and report an activity, so please plan to hold and participate in a Novena For Life.

Throughout the Order we are approaching 1, 000 ultrasound machines placed through the Supreme Council Ultrasound Machine Initiative. Dollar for dollar, Supreme Council will match your contributions when you organize the purchase of an ultrasound machine at a pregnancy center. While prayer is a great weapon to save lives, the answer to the prayer may come through the placement of a good ultrasound machine to a pregnancy center that serves women at risk of choosing abortion. Whether it is the effort of one council or many councils, the placement of one of these machines will save lives. A look at the picture can help the woman humanize the child growing inside her. The child growing inside is fully human, but that picture helps

the woman internalize it and choose life. Our work on purchasing the ultrasound machine and helping the women after they choose life is an answer to the prayers

On a personal note, I have heard of some women expecting multiple children that they should not have all of them because of various health or economic reasons. They might be shown an image from ultrasound machine or results from some tests to help them choose which baby to keep or which one(s) to abort. If you were given the image in this article and told to pick one of the two to abort, which one would you abort? I hope you didn't pick either one of them, but that is exactly what some want you to be able to do, scrap human life before it looks human. If we treat all human life with dignity, the choice of aborting a child is no longer an option in anyone's eyes and they will see that others truly want to help them in their most difficult times.

I encourage all of you to use our biggest weapon (prayer) and be part of the answer to those prayers to help women choose life and make their choice an easier option that what some abortion minded businesses want them to think.

Run a project which benefits our seminarians?


Ask our parishioners to donate in a special collection after Sunday Mass in October, January, and March?

As the new Marian image is brought on pilgrimage through the jurisdiction, councils will host the Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians icon for a prayer service at their parish.

Overview

The 2018-2019 Marian Prayer Program presents the 18th Marian image sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, this time of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. Each Knights of Columbus jurisdiction receives several Marian images, which serve as the centerpieces for prayer services conducted in churches and council meeting places throughout the Order for the duration of the initiative. Since its inception in 1979, the Knights of Columbus' Marian Prayer Program has held more than 166,900 local council and parish prayer services with some 20 million participants. This year, the prayer service is intended to raise awareness of the plight of Christians persecuted for their faith and to stand in prayerful solidarity with them.
